## **Year 6 Curriculum – Spring Term 2022**

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have really enjoyed welcoming Y6 back to school this week for the start of the Spring Term and would like to thank them for helping Miss Hackett-Smith settle in to her new job as class teacher for 6P. We hope everyone has had a great Christmas break and a good start to 2022.

The Spring Term is always a busy time in Y6 and we have lots of information to share with you about what we will be up to. This letter gives a brief overview of what we will cover during the term and we have also attached our new timetables to our Blog so that you can see what will be going on in class each day (although there may be occasions when sessions will need to swap around).

Maths	The daily maths lessons will be covering the below areas  Decimals Algebra The four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication & division) Ratio  We will continue to prepare the children for their Maths SATs tests in May by introducing				
	them to the style of Arithmetic and Reasoning questions that they will face in the tests and begin to introduce them to the test durations and expectations.				
English	<ul> <li>Fiction work:         <ul> <li>Narrative writing with a focus on developing suspense and tension within Warning Stories.</li> <li>Non-fiction work:</li></ul></li></ul>				
Reading	<ul> <li>Pupils will continue to work on exploring a range of texts in class. These will vary from the exploration of fiction, non-fiction and poetry. The children will respond to a variety of comprehension activities to demonstrate their understanding of the text.</li> <li>Time will also be allocated to hearing children read individually and time for pupils to read their own choice of books.</li> <li>Each class will have a class reader which will be shared with the class each day.</li> </ul>				

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	The Accelerated Reader programme allows children to take a quiz on the book they have read and earn points. This helps to monitor the children's understanding of the books they are reading. 	Pupils will begin to be introduced to the Reading SATs test so that they have a bett understanding of how reading will be tested and so that they understand how the timings of the tests work.								
Testing	All practise testing will be introduced in a relaxed manner in order to ensure the children have a good first experience of more formal testing. We will be communicating with parents, about SATs, as we move closer towards the tests (which take place in Term 5 on the week beginning 9/5/22).								
Foundation Subjects	This term we are exploring a range of interesting subjects and we have lots of exciting learning planned!								
Jubjects	<ul> <li>History – a focus on 'The Industrial Revolution' &amp; the power of the monarchy – Queen Victoria</li> <li>Science – exploring light, shadow and how we see things</li> <li>Art – the art work of LS Lowry, including tonal drawing work, perspective drawing and exploring how to draw people</li> <li>RE – Christianity – the main beliefs of the Christian faith</li> <li>Computing – exploring computer programming through the use of the 'logo' program</li> <li>French – pupils will be learning about how to tell the time</li> <li>Music – we will continue to use our Charanga music scheme where pupils will sing and play a range of tuned and untuned instruments to accompany a range of musical styles</li> <li>PSHE – learning practical first aid skills</li> </ul>

P.E.	6P will also be participating in Forest School sessions during Term 3.								
	Please try to ensure your child has an appropriate PE kit in school. Ideally, this should be in school every day as sometimes PE sessions have to switch for a variety of reasons. As we are in a winter term, it is really helpful if the children have a pair of joggers and a warmer top, in their PE kit, that they can wear for colder sessions.								
Homework	Please see the overview of homework for this term. This work will be set on TEAMS.								
Homework	R15E stands for 'Read 15 minutes Every day'								
	TTRS – Times Tables Rock Stars can be accessed on the following link and each pupil has their own log in. We would like them to complete 15 'Studio' games a week – each of these games lasts 1 minute. <u>Times Tables Rock Stars: Play (ttrockstars.com)</u>								
	Spellings – These sheets will go up, each week, to introduce the spelling pattern that we will be focusing on in class and will also highlight 4 'words of the week' from the Y5/6 Common Exception Work list. Spelling sheets will be put up on TEAMS on Mondays.								
	Homework will be posted on TEAMS on a Friday and will be due in by the following Friday.								
	We understand that the children participate in a range of clubs and activities out of school and recognise that it is not always possible for children to complete all of their homework. We are grateful for your support in encouraging your child to complete homework and we will give out
